Mark's Reflections

Today in our Gospel reading we have Luke's account of the Sermon on the Plain. (Luke 6:17-49)

It offers a rich and challenging reflection on how we as followers of Jesus are called to live in contrast to the norms of society. Unlike the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew, which is delivered on a mountain, the Sermon on the Plain occurs on a level place, symbolizing accessibility and the inclusivity of Jesus' message.

In this great passage we see:

Blessings and Woes v 20-26

Love Your Enemies v27-32

Judging Others v 37-42

Building on the Foundation of Christ v 43-49

Reflecting on the Sermon on the Plain is both a challenge and an invitation for us all.

It calls for a radical shift in priorities—valuing humility over pride, love over hate, and forgiveness over judgment. It's not easy, but it points to a deeper way of living that reflects the heart of God's kingdom.
